The month of January has been designated as "Thyroid Awareness Month". The American Association of Clinical Endocrinologists estimates that up to 30 million Americans may be affected by a thyroid disorder, with half of these cases currently undiagnosed. Two autoimmune disorders, Graves' disease and Hashimoto's thyroiditis are responsible for the vast majority of cases of hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid) and hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid). Patients with autoimmune thyroid disease may also be diagnosed with Graves' eye disease (also called thyroid eye disease), which can cause bulging eyes and double vision, as well as dryness, light sensitivity, and swelling. Patients with severe disease face multiple surgeries over a period of years in order to restore eye appearance and function.

"The effects of thyroid eye disease can have a devastating impact on a patient's quality of life", stated GDATF Executive Director Kimberly Dorris. "Many patients find it difficult to work due to vision issues, and the drastic change in appearance causes many to withdraw socially. Those who are living with Graves' eye disease can gain a sense of empowerment by learning about this condition and making connections with others who understand what they are going through. We are excited to bring this opportunity to patients and family members in Southern California."
